Crochet for Baby * Sweater

The asymmetrical front adds interest to this kimono shaped baby sweater which allows room for a growing baby.

The sweater is worked from cuff to cuff in double crochet through the back loop. The contrasting edge stitch can be in the color of your choice.



Crochet for Baby * Sweater

Special Pattern Notes:

Sweater is worked from cuff to cuff. **DCtbl**—Double Crochet through the back loop. The ch 3 of the previous row counts as the first DC of the row. At the beg of the row DCtbl in the 2nd st from the hook. At the end of the row the st in the ch 3 loop of the row below is the last st of the row.

Right Side of the sweater is the baby's right arm and is the wide side of the front.

Left Side of the sweater is the baby's left arm and is the narrow side of the front.

Right Front: Ch 31 sts.

Row 1: DC in 3rd ch from hook and DC across row. Ch 3 and turn (30 sts).

Row 2-6: DCtbl across row, ch 3 and turn.

Row 7: DCtbl across row, ch 10 sts.

Cut yarn and fasten off st. Put Right Front aside and begin at the left sleeve cuff below.

Left Cuff: Ch 33 sts very loosely.

Row 1: DC across row, ch 3 and turn (32 sts).

Rows 2-13: DCtbl across row, ch 3 and turn.

Back and Left Front:

Row 14: DCtbl across row. At end of row, ch 23 sts and turn.

Row 15: DC in 3rd st from hook, DC in each st of chain. DCtbl to end of row. Ch 23 sts and turn.

Row 16: DC in 3rd st from hook, DC in each st of chain. DCtbl to end of row. Ch 3 and turn.

Row 17-21: DCtbl across row, ch 3 and turn (76 sts).

Back: Cont to work back only.

Row 22: DCtbl 36 st, ch 3 and turn.

Row 23-29: DCtbl across row, ch 3 and turn.

Back and Right Front:

Row 30: DCtbl across Back. Pick up Right Front piece and beginning at the end of the ch, DC in each of the 10 chained sts. Cont to work across Right Front by DCtbl to end of row (76 sts).

Row 31-35: DCtbl across row, ch 3 and turn.

Right Sleeve: Begin working other sleeve only.

Row 36: DC tbl for 54 sts, ch 3 and turn.

Row 37: DCtbl 32 sts, ch 3 and turn.

Row 38-49: DCtbl across row, ch 3 and turn.

Row 50: DCtbl across row. Cut yarn and fasten off st.

Crochet for Baby * Sweater

Fold sweater in half along the top of shoulder line of the sleeves and sew side seams and underarm seams front to back. The sleeves may be folded up to fit a younger baby, so make the seams as neatly as possible.

Left Front: Hold sweater with RS facing beg at back left corner of neck.

- Row 1: Sk 10 sts and join yarn in 11th st. Ch 3 and DCtbl to end of row, ch 3 and turn (30 sts).
- Row 2: DCtbl across row, ch 3 and turn.
- Row 3: DCtbl across row. Cut yarn and fasten off st.

Cuffs Contrast Edging: Join yarn at seam with RS facing.

- Rnd 1: Ch 1 and SC in each st, join rnd with a sl st.
- Rnd 2: Rep Rnd 2. Cut yarn and fasten off st.

Neck and Hem Contrast Edging: Join yarn at upper corner of Right Front with RS facing.

- Rnd 1: Ch 1 and SC around neck, left front, bottom hem and right front. Make 1 SC in each st, 2 SC in the DCtbl sts, and 1 extra SC when turning a corner. Join rnd with a sl st, ch 1 and turn.
- Rnd 2: SC in next 2 sts and ch 7 sts to form button loop, sk 4 SC, SC in 5th st from hook, ch 1 and turn.
- Rnd 3: SC in each of the ch sts for the button loop and cont to SC for rnd. When you reach button loop at end of the rnd, join with a sl st. Cut yarn and fasten off st.

Finishing: Weave in all ends.

Overlap the fronts, right over left, so they are equal in width to the back. Securely sew button in place. Block if needed.
