# Broken Rib Hat and Scarf

Knit this matching hat and scarf for yourself or as a gift, then wrap up in this warm and cozy set when the winter wind blows. Knitting with super bulky yarn makes for a quick project completion.

## Broken Rib Ladies' Bulky Hat

(Finished head circumference approx. 21.5")

With circular size US 13 needle, cast on 54 st(s). Join, place marker, being careful not to twist st(s).

Rounds 1-3: \* k1, p1; repeat from \* around.

Round 4: \* p1, k1; repeat from \* around.

Repeat these four rounds five more times (6 repeats worked altogether), then work round 1 once.

Change to size US 13 dpn(s) to begin crown shaping.

Crown shaping:

Next round: ssk around: 27 st(s) remain.

Next round: \*ssk; repeat \* to last st, k1: 14 st(s) remain.

Next round: ssk around: 7 st(s) remain.

Cut yarn, leaving a 6" length. Draw tail through remaining st(s) tightly and secure. Weave in ends.

## Broken Rib Bulky Scarf

(Size approx. 6" x 67" inches)

With size US 13 needles, cast on 15 st(s) for a 6" wide scarf.

Work back and forth over the following 4 row pattern repeat.

Rows 1 & 3: \* k1, p1; repeat from \*, end k1.

Row 2: \*p1, k1; repeat from \*, end p1.

Row 4: \*k1, p1; repeat from \*, end k1.

Work rows 1- 4 of pattern until scarf measures 67" or desired length.

End with row 2. Bind off in rib pattern.
