GAUGE

24 sts = 4'' in pattern
using larger needles

Knitting Needles:
Needles US # 7 (4 ½mm)
& 5 (3 ¾mm) or size
needed to obtain gauge

Notions:
Approximately 9 buttons.
Depending upon size of
sweater.

Note:
*The # of buttons will be
determined by the quantity
of stitches picked up along
front edges.*

Child's Mock Cable Sweater

This heirloom worthy sweater features mock cables throughout the body of the sweater, also as ribbing and center cables down the sleeves. A professional finish with I-cord buttonholes. The perfect sweater for your little princess.



To check gauge CO 24 sts and work in pattern for 7 repeats plus 2 rows. Work should measure 4" (you will end the 1st row with P1)

MC = (Mock Cable St) sl next 3 sts to right-hand needle, pass the 3rd st on the right-hand needle over the first 2 sts as if you were binding it off. Sl those 2 sts back onto left-hand needle, K1, yo, K1

Mock Cable Pattern:

Row 1—K1, P1, *MC, P3, repeat from * to last 5 sts, MC, P1, K1

Row 2—K the K sts, P the P sts and yarn overs

Rows 3 & 4—K the K sts & P the P sts

Repeat Rows 1-4 for pattern

Back:

CO 79 (85, 91, 97, 103)

Row 1 is a right side row

Work in pattern until work measures 7 3/4 (8 1/4, 10 1/4, 11 3/4, 13 1/4)" ending having worked a WS row.

Armhole Shaping:

Continue in established pattern while working the following shaping.

- At beginning of the next 2 rows BO 5 sts
- At beginning of the following 2 rows BO 4 sts
- Dec 1st each end of needle every RS row 1 (1, 2, 2) times
- There will remain 59 (65, 71, 75, 81) sts
- Continue even until armholes measure 5 1/2 (6 1/2, 7, 7 1/2, 8)"
- At beginning of next 2 rows BO 5 (6, 6, 7, 8) sts
- At beginning of following 2 rows BO 5 (5, 6, 6, 7)
- At beginning of following 2 rows BO 4(5, 5, 6, 7)
- BO remaining 31 (33, 37, 37, 37) sts

Left Front:

CO 39 (42, 45, 48, 51) sts

- Work in pattern until piece measures same as back to armhole ending having worked a WS row. When working row 1 of pattern end with a K1 instead of P1, K1,
- At beg of next row BO 5 sts
- At beg of following RS row BO 4 sts
- Dec 1 st at beg of needle every RS row 1 (1, 1, 2, 2) times
- There will remain 29 (32, 35, 37, 40)

- Continue even until armhole measures 4 (5, 5 1/2, 6, 6 1/2)" ending with a RS row

Shape crew neck:

- At beg of next WS row BO 6 (8, 10, 10, 10) sts, work to end
- At beg of next WS row BO 3 sts
- At beg of next WS row BO 2sts 2 (1, 1, 1, 1) times
- Dec 1 st at neck edge every RS row 2 (3, 3, 3, 3) times (best to make the decs 1 sts from edge)
- There will remain 14 (16, 17, 19, 22) sts
- Continue even until piece measures same as back to shoulder.
- At armhole edge (beg of RS row) BO 5 (6, 6, 7, 8) sts
- At beginning of next RS row BO 5 (5, 6, 6, 7) sts
- At beginning of all following rows BO 4 (5, 5, 6, 7) sts

Right Front:

Work as for left front but reverse shaping (i.e. BO for armhole & shoulder at beg of WS rows and shape neck at beg of RS rows) and starting row 1 of pattern with a K1, eliminate the P1 then repeating from the *

Sleeves (make 2):

With smaller needles CO 35 (39, 41, 45, 47) sts
Work 8 rows of Mock Cable Pattern

Change to larger needles and work in sleeve pattern.

Place markers after st 13 (15, 16, 18, 19) and another mkr after the next 9 sts

Sleeve Pattern:

Row 1—(RS) K1, P to mkr, MC, P3, MC, P to last st, K1

Row 2—(WS) P1, K to mkr, K the Ks and P the Ps to next mkr, K to last st, P1

Row 3—(RS) K1, P to mkr, K the K sts & P the P sts to next mkr.,P to last st, K1

Row 4— (WS) repeat row 2

Repeat these 4 rows of Sleeve Pattern while increasing 1 st each side every 4th row 1 (10, 11, 10, 14) times as follows:

Increase rows: WS, P1, M1, K to mkr, K the Ks & P the Ps to next mkr, K to last st, M1, P1

Continue repeating rows 1-4 increasing each side every 6th row 10 (5, 6, 8, 6) times

There will remain 57 (69, 75, 81, 87) sts

Work even if necessary until work measures 11 (11 3/4, 13, 4 1/2, 15)''

Shape Cap:

- At beg of next 2 rows BO 5 sts
- At beg of following 2 rows BO 4 sts
- On following rows keep 1st and last st in stockinette (this will be a selvage edge and make it easier to stitch the sleeves to the body)
- Dec 1 st each side of needle every RS row 8 (9, 11, 11, 11)times
- BO 2 sts at beg of next 0 (4, 4, 6, 8) rows
- BO 3 sts at beg of next 4 rows
- There will remain 11 (13, 15, 17, 19) sts
- BO remaining sts

Sew fronts to back at shoulder seams.

Neck Ribbing:

Row 1—With RS facing and smaller needles, pick up and K 1 sts for every st on BO sts, 3sts for every 4 rows to BO sts along back, pick up & K 1 sts for every BO st along back, 3 sts for every 4 rows to front BO sts, 1 sts for each BO sts at neck edge.

Row 2—K1, P1 for 5 rows

BO in ribbing.

Button Band:

With RS of left front facing & smaller needle, pick up and k 3 sts for every 4 rows along front edge. K 5 rows, BO

Buttonhole Band

With RS of right front facing & smaller needle, pick up and k3 sts for every 4 rows along front edge.

K 1 row adjusting sts to a multiple of 7

Button hole I-cord:

- [K1, K2tog tbl, sl sts back to left-hand needle] 5 times, K2
- [sl sts back to left needle, K2] 3 times
- Leaving sts on right needle, move 2 sts from left needle to right needle and lift 1st st over 2nd st as in binding off
- Sl next st from left needle to right needle and slip first st over second as before
- Move all 3 sts back to left needle and repeat from 1st bullet until only 5 sts remain then repeat 1st bullet and BO

Sew sleeves to armholes. Sew sleeve seams and side seams.

Weave in all loose ends

Sew buttons on button band to match buttonholes.
