This crocheted headband is a super easy, quick project that can be finished in a few hours. Our Bear Creek 100% wool yarn will keep your ears warm on cold days and provide plenty of color.

Or choose our Perfection Super Bulky yarn
for easy care.



Designer Notes:

- ⇒ Wind hank of yarn into two separate balls before beginning.
- ⇒ Headband is worked in joined rounds with right side always facing and with two strands of yarn held together.

Special Stitches:

- **sc2tog (Single Crochet 2 Together)** = [Insert hook in next st, yo, pull up a loop] twice, yo, draw through all 3 loops on hook (1 st decreased).
- **V-st (V-Stitch)** = (Dc, ch 1, dc) in indicated stitch

Rounds 3 and 4: Sl st in ch-sp of first V-st, ch 4, dc in same ch-sp (ch-4 and following dc count as first V-st), V-st in ch-1 sp of each V-st around; join with sl st in 3rd ch of beginning ch-4. - 10 (11, 12) V-sts

Round 5: Ch 1, working in each dc and ch-1 sp and beginning in same st as join, sc in first 4 sts, sc2tog, [sc in next 9 (10, 11) sts, sc2tog] twice, sc in next 2 (3, 4) sts; join to first sc. - 27 (30, 33) sc.

FINISHING

Weave in ends and enjoy.

Begin:

With 2 strands of yarn held together, ch 30 (33, 36), being careful not to twist the chain; join (slip stitch) to first ch.

Round 1 (right side): Ch 1, do not turn, sc in same ch as join and in each ch around; join with sl st in first sc. - 30 (33, 36) sc.

Round 2: Ch 4, dc in same st as join (beginning ch-4 and following dc count as first V-st), [sk next 2 sts, V-st in next st] 9 (10, 11) times, sk last 2 sts; join with sl st in 3rd ch of beginning ch-4. - 10 (11,12) V-sts.
