Easy Rib Twist Shawl

This shawl is super easy and knitted in a K1 twist, P1 rib. It is a rectangle with two slits for the armholes but creates a very pleasant, interesting shape when worn. Knitted in a worsted weight yarn for hand dyeing, this shawl can be made in its natural color or dyed in any color or color combination you create.

Easy Rib Twist Shawl

Note:

K1b = K 1 through the back loop

Cast on 131 sts

Row 1: K across

Row 2 – sl1, *K1b, P1, repeat from * across

Row 3 – sl1, *P1, K1b, repeat from * to last 2 sts, P1, K1

Repeat rows 2 & 3 until work measures 10"

Dividing row – work 59 sts in established pattern, PM, attach second ball of yarn and continue across row in established pattern.

Armhole rows:

Next row - work in established pattern to marker, drop working yarn, pick up yarn from other ball and continue across row in established pattern (you are working sts on either side of marker with two different balls of yarn, thus making a slit for armhole). Continue in established pattern working with a different ball of yarn for each side of the slit until opening measures 9 1/2".

Now continue across work with one ball of yarn in established pattern until piece after armhole measures 14".

Work a second armhole as before, making sure the openings line up since the opening is closer to one side of the shawl than the other.

After finishing the second armhole, continue across work with one ball of yarn in established pattern for 10" to match other side of shawl. Bind off in ribbing. Work in ends of yarn. No need to block work.
