Tender Wraps

Bundle your baby in this fun reversible blanket. Stockinette, reverse stockinette and seed stitch make up the textured sections in this simply dapper wrapper!!! This pattern also works great in Little Lehigh.

Pattern Introduction

The first row after the border sets up the pattern. Place markers to keep it easy to follow, the markers are to be slipped each time you come to them. We are going to have an 11 stitch boarder of seed stitch beginning and ending with K1 then 33 stitches of Purls, 33 stitches of Knits, a middle section of 33 stitches of seed stitch beginning and ending with K1, then 33 Purls and 33 more knit stitches ending with an 11 stitch border of seed stitch.

Seed stitch is:

Row 1: K1, P1, K1, P1, K1

Row 2: K1, P1, K1, P1, K1

When you look at your work, if the stitch on your lhn is a Purl stitch, you will Knit it. If the stitch on your lhn is a Knit stitch, you will Purl it. By doing seed stitch over an odd number of stitches you can repeat the same row over and over. And that is what we are going to do.

Pattern

CO 187 sts

Knit in seed stitch pattern for 2 inches then begin pattern:

* K1P1 repeat from * 4 more times, K1, PM, P33, pm, K33, pm, ** K1 P1 repeat from ** 15 more times, K1, pm, P33, pm, K33, pm, *** K1P1 repeat from *** 4 more times, K1.

Repeat this row slipping the markers as you come to them, for 34" from cast on edge.

Then Knit two inches of seed stitch, removing marker as you come to them. BO loosely and pull in ends.

Wash on gentle and block out flat to dry. When dry, bundle your baby and go!!!!

This blanket will pleat between knit and purl sections due to the nature of the stitches.
