# Bedford Springs Shawl With Cobweb Frill

The cobweb frill edge of this shawl provides an elegant edge. This shawl is worked from the outer cobweb frill and continues in seed stitch to the neck edge. One skein of yarn is used to create this shawl!  
Take it with you everywhere.

**Note:**

Shawl is worked sideways beginning with the frill. Cast-on using two needle points if necessary for a loose edge.

**Seed Stitch** (odd number of sts):

All rows: K1; \*P1, K1; rep from \* across row.

**Cobweb Frill** (multiple of 3 + 1):

**Row 1:** K1 tbl, \*P2, K1 tbl; rep from \* across row.

**Row 2:** P1; \*K1 tbl, K1, P1; rep from \* across row.

**Repeat rows 1 & 2** for desired length of border, ending with row 2 of pattern.

**Final Row:** K 1 tbl, \*drop next st off needle, P1, K1 tbl; rep from \* across row.

**Shawl:**

With US 9 circular needle (or size needed to obtain gauge), cast on 319 sts LOOSELY. (106 reps of 3 + 1)

Work Rows 1 & 2 of Cobweb Frill pattern 8 times for a total of 16 rows.

Then work Final Row of Cobweb Frill pattern (213 sts remain)

Work in seed stitch for approx. 9" or desired length until approx. 5 yards of yarn remain. (After working a few seed stitch rows, unravel the dropped sts all the way down to the cast-on row.)

Frill will measure approx. 3.5" in length

Bind off all sts loosely in pattern.

Weave in all ends.

Block lightly to measurements.
